We understand that the Ford, Devlin, and Beatty families immigrated to Canada about 1825 and settled in this area on farms. There was only one home at that time and as these families had come from Omagh Ireland, it was decided to name the little place Omagh.

Omagh store was opened and was well patronized until a few years ago and is now a residence. The post office was in a home in the west corner of the fourth line, operated by a Mrs. Smith and all living in the area had to pick up their mail. About 1908 rural mail delivery was started.

The Irish visitors were much interested in Omagh Presbyterian church which is located between the second and third conces-
