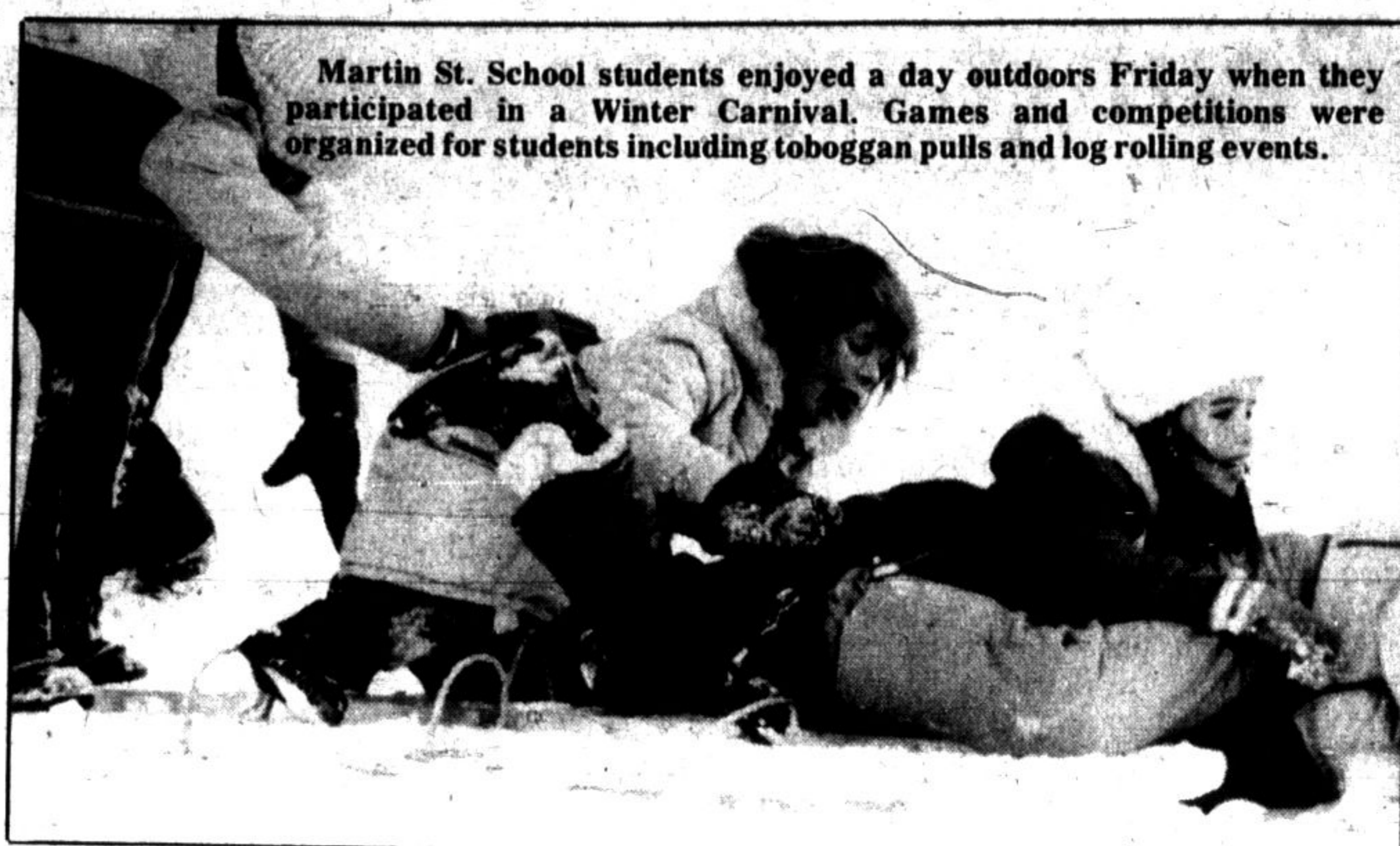
A total \$316.84 was realized in the Terry Fox run for our area.
