Plaques not dough a 'farce' — Betty Fisher

The provincial government's idea to do away with the \$100 cash award for Ontario Scholars and present just a plaque is "a farce" and "skirting the issue", says Halton Board of Education chairman Betty Fisher. The Georgetown trustee looks upon the possible reason behind the proposal as "saving money" and not facing the matter head on, from the provincial point of view. Mrs. Fisher stressed she was speaking as an individual and was not necessarily presenting the view of the other trustees. However, she feels the real issue is

clouded and the plaque proposal is not solving the problem.

Mrs. Fisher said she is all for Ontario Scholars, but feels the marks counted should be for the first time marks, and not for those courses taken over.

Mrs. Fisher told The Champion in a lot of cases students want to better their marks and take the same course two or three, or more times.

While she emphasized she is not against students doing this, labelling it "commendable", she does not think it right a second or third time around that the mark should be used when it comes to figuring out percentages for the scholars.

She does not think students getting 80 per cent or more after the first try should be in the same "bunch" as those who try more than once.

The Georgetown representative said she recently learned the Ministry of Education was considering doing away with the cash awards because they were becoming suspicious of the high number of scholars in recent years.

Mrs. Fisher contends the plaques are "dumb." She says the government is saying keep the status quo, but give out plaques instead of money.

She feels the ministry is still commemorating someone who they feel does not deserve it.

"They are talking out of two sides of their mouths," she said.

Mrs. Fisher admits she thought about the Ontario Scholar situation even before it was brought up by the ministry.

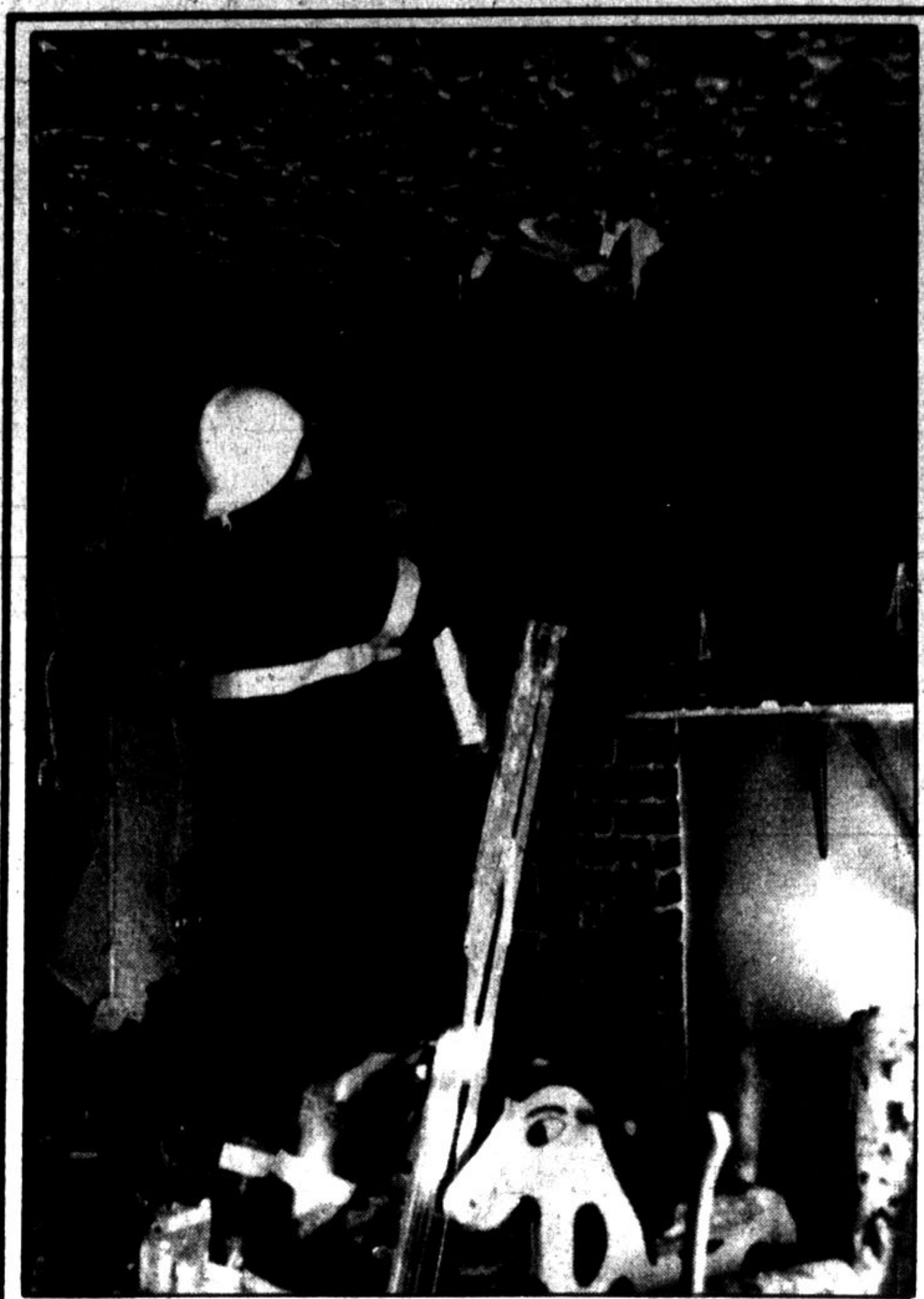
Your number for emergency

Confused about who to call if there is a flood problem, road cave-in or a tree comes down on your road after regular business hours?

The Town of Milton emergency number is 878-7141, but it appears some local residents are not aware of the special number, which is listed in the municipal directory and the blue pages of the telephone directory.

Too often, residents are calling the Town Hall direct or the Works Department and not receiving an answer, councillors were recently advised.

Town Administrator Roy Main informed councillors that the 878-7141 number connects callers with the Central Fire Hall Dispatch Centre, which then passes the emergency to the appropriate department.
