The telephone rings and when you answer, the person on the line tells you he is going to commit suicide.

Not many people would know how to respond in such a situation but a group of trained volunteers not only know how, they've had experience. Those volunteers are the voices which reach out to people in crisis through the North Halton Contact Centre crisis line.

"The more volunteers the better it is," said Pat Wood of the service.

A series of training sessions for crisis line volunteers begins Tues. May 1 at 7.30 p.m. continues for three consecutive Tuesdays. The final session will take in an entire Saturday.

"We teach how to handle calls and develop a relationship with the caller," explained Contact Centre volunteer Mrs. Wood.

One of the functions of a volunteer is to inform callers of services in the community which might be able to assist them.

Through training, volunteers learn the importance of developing a rapour with callers, Representatives from various community

groups will describe services offered during the day-long session. The North Halton Contact Centre has contact information available for more than 1,000 services.

Prospective volunteers can expect to donate 12 hours each month, usually split into four-hour shifts.

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

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


