





# Town sets budget with 6.2/5.08% hike

Approval next Tuesday evening of the Town's proposed operating and capital budget will result in a tax increase of 6.2 per cent for urban residents and 5.08 per cent for rural homeowners.

"The Town of Milton is being excessively responsible," said Town Administrator Roy Main who indicated the municipality's portion of the overall tax increase is 0.48 mills or a 1.04 per cent increase over the 1983 figures.

Working on \$5,000 worth of assessment for Milton taxpayers, a 6.2 per cent increase will result in an additional \$61.45 of taxation for urban dwellers and \$47.10 for rural citizens as a result of the 5.08 per cent in-

The largest slice of the tax hike will go towards elementary and secondary education (\$35.10) with the Region receiving \$10.95 and the Town of Milton receiving \$13.

The largest contributing factor to the municipal tax increase is the allocation of \$225,000 to be used for legal fees to fight the Ontario Waste Management Corporation.

"We have to defend ourselves," said Mayor Gord Krantz, adding he was not about to let Milton become known as the "dump capital of Ontario or Canada."

Mayor Krantz said the budget would have been less than a 5 per cent increase if it had not been

necessary for the legal fees. Mr. Main indicated however, that


a successful battle could result in the town recouping much of the legal expenses.

The proposed capital budget will cover such projects as phase two of the Bronte St. reconstruction, sidewalk program, purchase of a half ton truck, purchase of a fire pumper for Station 2 Campbellville, new pool heaters for Rotary Park, reconstruction of Steeles Ave. (with Region), construction work on the Millborough Town Line, purchase of a sander hopper, and additional sidewalk work.

This year's proposed budget however, will result in no reserve allocation to the storm sewer or property acquisition account, tentatively set at \$100,000 combined. The accounts currently have \$185,000 and \$95,000 respectively.


