Girls T-Ball ready to roll

Milton Girls T-Ball starts its season this week with a slate of 14 teams; eight juniors and six seniors. This year, in order to ensure a high level of participation by each player, the teams have been held to a maximum of 13 players.

Anticipating girls registering right up until the start of the season, some room was left on the teams to accommodate those girls; however, there is only a handful of openings remaining on a first-come basis. So if you wish your daughter to play she must be registered immediately.

The regular season will continue to the last weeks of August, after which a championship round will begin, leading up to Championship Day which will be held one Saturday after Labour Day.

Parents accustomed to the regular Ancaster T-Ball rules will soon notice that MGTB rules are somewhat different. These changes were introduced with the specific objective of improving the game by increasing activity, spreading that activity more equally to all players, speeding up the game and reducing boredom.

To see that all girls partake in some infield action in every game, every girl must play at least once in the infield. No one can be delegated to the outfield for the season.

To guarantee no girl is singled out for excessive bench time, no player may be sat out a second time while there is a player on her team who has not yet sat out. Thus, even the best players must take their turn to be benched, before other players can be sat out · a second time.

To speed the fun (or pressure) of being last batter to more players, in each inning a different (designated) last batter is used. . This is accomplished simply by skipping the designated last batter in the batting order and playing her last.

It eliminates the frustration to coaches of players who arrive late. Under Ancaster rules, late players are added to the bottom of the batting line-up and thus become the · last batter. Late players may effect the outcome of the game if they happen to be weaker batters. Coaches often leave writing up the score sheets to the last possible moment so not to be adversely effected by late players (often delaying the start of the (game)

Another reason coaches delay writing up score sheets is that often, under Ancaster style rules, equalization of batters is accomplished by having the team with fewer players bat extra batters in each inning. Again late players may adversely effect the batting order of either team. MGTB avoids this technical problem by always playing an equal number of nine batters and nine fielders. There is no rotation of extra bat-

The use of only nine players is another divergence from Ancaster rules which uses 11 fielders (two extra outfielders). MGTB feels that there is little enough activity in the outfield and that extra outfielders only dilute outfield play making that position boring. However reducing the number of batters to nine does not mean that there is less batting action because MGTB plays five innings for a total of 90 bats per game as compared to 88 under Ancaster rules when only four innings are played.

In MGTB, the pitcher is not allowed to

assist the catcher with the last-batter play; the catcher must handle that responsibility on her own.

Finally, the "Time" call: Under Ancaster, "time" will be called when the fielders have decided not to make a play. Under MGTB, "time" is called when they have either stopped the runners by getting the ball in a threatening position ahead of the runners or they have succeeded in getting the ball to the pitcher or to the catcher.
