

## Horse racing at Mohawk will continue

The Ontario provincial government says it is taking steps to ensure the horse racing industry is sustainable.

It has reached an agreement with Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG) that will ensure live horse racing continues at Mohawk Racetrack in Milton and Woodbine Racetrack in Toronto for the next two

Addressing the media Thursday morning during a news conference at the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame at Woodbine Racetrack in Toronto, WEG officials revealed its 2013 standardbred racing schedule will include 84 dates at Mohawk.

It was also announced that Woodbine will once again be home of the Queen's Plate and host 133 thoroughbred and 99 standardbred racing days.
