# Committee discusses snowstorm response

The weather and what the Town of Milton could do better to respond to a major snow-storm stirred up heavy discussion at the Town's administration and planning committee meeting Monday.

Engineering Director Paul Cripps told councillors it was the worst snowstorm Milton has seen in five years, dropping about 25 to 35 cms of snow over the course of Friday.

Even with the snow removal team out during the afternoon before the storm to salt and sand the roads, he explained, the trucks had a challenging time keeping up with the snowfall, especially near the end of the night. The snow stopped falling at about 10 p.m.

"Clearing operations on our local roads started at approximately 7:30 p.m. on Friday evening," said Cripps, explaining that by 10 or 11 p.m., most of the fleet had moved off the arterial roads and through residential streets.

"Local roads were finished up Sunday morning at approximately 1 a.m.," he continued. "That's about 26 hours after the snow stopped so we did not meet our 24-hour service projection."

#### Meeting planned

Local and Regional Councillor Colin Best has invited Metrolinx staff to Milton to speak about The Big Move next week.

Residents can attend the meeting at the Milton Sports Centre Wednesday from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m. and ask questions about Metrolinx's plan to tackle gridlock and improve transportation access, integration and efficiency in the Greater Toronto and Hamilton Area over the next 25 years.

Last month at a town council meeting, Best called The Big Move 'The Big Stall' because he questions whether the plan addresses the transportation needs of Milton's growing community.
