'Sunshine List' reveals region's highest paid officials

The president and CEO of Halton Healthcare Services (HHS) is once again Halton's highest-paid public sector official.

John Oliver, who earned \$477,520 in salary and taxable benefits in 2012, is among the growing list of public sector employees in Halton and across the province who earn six figures or more annually, according to the so-called

Sunshine List released by Ontario's Ministry of Finance recently.

The list discloses public sector salaries from last year of individuals making more than \$100,000 a year.

In 2012, 89 HHS employees made the list, up from 80 in 2011 and 77 from 2010, while 391 Halton Region employees were among those who earned more than \$100,000, up from 339 employees in 2011.

Oliver has earned relatively the same salary since 2010 because of a pay

Velodrome to launch
