## Business without advertising is like winking Clear understanding vital to dealing in the dark ~ You know what you're doing ~ with disagreements with your child but nobody else does!

How do I get my 4 year old to show his opinions and disagreement in a respectful way?

## Answer:

An important prerequisite to changing behaviour is a clear understanding of the cause of the behaviour. The solution can then focus on teaching acceptable alternatives. A good place to start is by acknowledging thoughts and feelings. I can see that you're upset but...

Children develop social skills through social experiences — through modeling, direct instruction and recognition. To illustrate, picture Mary grocery shopping with dad. They're in line at the check out as an elderly lady ahead of them struggles to lift her grocery items onto the counter. Dad offers to help and the lady expresses her thanks. At the playground later dad watches as Mary offers to help another child lift a heavy pail of sand out of the sand box. Modeling is learning by example.

Direct instruction refers to teaching or coaching, providing clear, concise information as to the behaviour we want to see. So for example, if a child says, I'm not eating that yucky dinner! The response could be, If you don't like the


food it's polite to say, I don't care for any. Recognition refers to giving acknowledgement — highlighting when things are going well or there's been improvement.

A positive, nurturing relationship forms the foundation upon which we guide children's behaviour, and with consistency and practice children learn socially acceptable ways of communicating.
