



## Special permit granted to cut trees

Regional council approved a special council permit to remove trees and build a home at 13160 Nassagaweya-Esquesing Townline. An application was received by Regional staff late February, detailing the applicant's plan to develop 0.42 hectares of the 2-hectare piece of land to house a single-detached home, garage, septic system, pool and in-ground geothermal system. However, in order to do so, about 80 trees (0.24 hectares) would have to be removed.

Conditions to the permit include having the applicant plant trees and shrubs on 0.19 hectares within two years after the permit is issued and having a certified arborist or registered professional forester visit before, during and after construction.


time, with a round of applause.
