



## Art gets personal in FASM Studio Tour

A performance artist as well as a stained glass artist who's passionate about his livelihood are among the dozens of exhibitors who will share their creative spirit with the public this weekend in the annual Fine Arts Society of Milton (FASM) Studio Tour

FASM spokesperson Nancy Cuttle said the popular event draws crowds every year people anxious for a chance to see the studios that artists use as creative space.

Visitors are invited to ask questions, watch art in progress, see demonstrations and purchase pieces

The studio tour also provides an opportunity for people to take in rural roads and country as many of the artists are spread out across Milton and beyond

The free, self-guided tour of artists' studios will take place this Saturday and Sunday from 10 a.m to 5 p.m at 24 locations. Featured are 36 artists painters, potters, an enamallist, photographers, jewelers and blown glass art 1515.

One of those in the tour is Bev Hewitt, a stained glass artist who's called Milton home for the last two years. He works out of his urban residence creating everything from

geometric designs following Islamic art to abstract pieces with a wealth of texture and colour

Colourful butterflies, flowers, birds and landscapes spring from the glass he so carefully pieces together.

Hewitt, 64, says he fell into his art career by accident.

"My wife (Katherine) kicked me out of the house," he chuckled. "She told me to find a hobby - what about stained glass?" He said the rest is history. He began taking a two-week course at Fanshawe College in London. Within days, his instructor asked him if he'd like to work for him. Hewitt was floored and thrilled to find work after mail ing out 45 resumes in 1990 with no success "He said I had natural aptitude," Hewitt re called "I ve still got that piece 16 pieces of glass my first project

Now, 23 years later his hobby has become a full-time career and he's commissioned to produce pieces for customers far and wide. He says his work is unique, and encourages people to come out to see it firsthand, since his online website simply doesn't do glass *lustice* 

His work, along with that of some painters, will be on display at Waldie's Blacksmith Shop

Meanwhile an artist whois making a name for herself across canada, having been ac cerpitered into more than 70 juned exhibitions will display her work at her Second Line studio in Campbellville

Tina Newlove has received many awards for her work including an Award of Merit from the Society of Canadian Artists

Her abstract oil painting titled Organizing My Mind is in the City of Torontos permanent collection

Newlove, whos one of the core artists in Tribe of One, will also share her passion for performance art. Tribe of One fuses together old world culture with modern artistic expression. They create innovative, cross cultural performances that blend sound, dance performance painting and storytelling.

Cuttle, a sculptor whose own studio is one of the stops on the tour said Milton residents are lucky to have this calibre of artists living here

"It's wonderful the talent is so varied," she said. "I think it's one of the reasons the an nual studio tour is so successful."

Part of the success may also be attributed to the allure of the behind-the-scenes look witnessing artistry in motion


Being able to see art up close and hands on gets others excited and interested in art. Cuttle added






