Project FARMS results in charges

Halton police laid 20 charges under the Highway Traffic Act in a recent initiative to keep vehicles moving with and around farm equipment on roadways.

Police conducted Project Farmers And Road users Moving Safely (FARMS) between September 23 and October 4. Officers dedicated more than 15 hours strictly to the enforcement of FARMS during the two-week period. Police say the charges include:

- a speeding charge for a vehicle overtaking farm equipment
- an unsafe movement charge
- six equipment charges (safety equipment violations concerning brakes, steering, suspension and tires) involving two separate commercial vehicles
- two equipment charges involving a farm vehicle
- 10 administrative charges (such as improper proof of insurance/updated licence stickers)

FARMS is a new project and it's anticipated that next year's project hours will increase.


Police say it will likely be activated again during the spring planting season of 2014.
