Spartans thriving in gridiron debut

Hard as it may be to believe, just eight months ago there was still plenty of question as to whether Craig Kielburger Secondary School should - or even could - join the gridiron scene.

Many teachers and prospective coaches had come over from E.C. Drury — which closed in June 2012 to make way for the new school, and where (due partly to its smaller size) there had never been any football.

To that end, the cause for doubt was clear.

"We just didn't know if this (starting junior football team) could be done," admitted head coach Dave Forsyth. "There was a lot of rumblings that this wouldn't happen; simply because it had never happened before."

But with a much bigger student body to draw from, the potential was there.

Recalled Grade 10 quarterback Steven Aichele, "With that nice turf field out there, I'm sure a lot of guys were thinking they wanted a team." That's something of an understatement, as it turned out.

Needing to gauge student interest before proceeding, Forsyth and company held a meeting in February that drew roughly 75 football hopefuls.

That number swelled to 100 for last month's tryouts, and the Spartans - enjoying ample coaching support as well, with seven assistants

- have been firing on all cylinders ever since.

"Suddenly there's a football culture at this school," said Forsyth, following Tuesday's 41-6 dismantling of host Milton District that lifted Craig Kielburger to 4-0 in Halton's Tier 3 ranks. "It's exciting to see. They're riding the wave."

The Spartans' instant success is especially impressive given that only three players on the team had ever played the game before.

"Yeah, you could say commitment and enthusiasm has overcome our inexperience," said Forsyth, who has four years coaching experience in the Hamilton minor rep system.

Of course, having a fairly seasoned hand at the controls has been a major benefit as well.

Having suited up for three different clubs over the past eight years including with the Halton Cowboys

- Aichele has a lot more poise and knowledge than the average Tier 3 junior quarterback.
