

Debut novelist to visit Milton library

Tanis Rideout will discuss her popular debut novel, *Above All Things*, when she visits the Milton Public Library Wednesday Nov. 27. The Toronto-based writer will talk about the research she conducted in penning a historical fiction account of Englishman George Mallory's 1924 final – and fatal – attempt to climb Mount Everest.

Blending fact and fiction, Rideout's novel centres around both the climber and his wife. Published in 2012, *Above All Things* was named one of the best books of the year by the *Globe and Mail*, Amazon.ca and the iBookstore. Rideout will also hold a question-and-answer session about her debut novel and sign copies of it between 7 and 8:30 p.m. at the library's main branch at 1010 Main St. E.


in the music industry, but he's wise enough to realize that might not happen.
