EVAPORATIVE DRY EYE DISEASE

Dry eye is in part, due to failure of the meibomian glands of the eye lid to produce and distribute the oil layer of the tear film.

Your tears are composed of three layers.

- Mucin, which is a wetting layer, making the cornea and front of your eye wettable.
- Aqueous layer, which is water and your antibodies.
- Meibum, which is oil that is protecting your tears from evaporating.

The margins of your eyelids contain approximately 40 meibomian glands, each approximately 5 mm long, just inside the line of lashes.

Improper hygiene and care causes the glands to become occluded, unable to secrete oils, and in time become infected, and can degenerate.

Makeup, dust, dust mites, bacteria, and poor quality tears collect in the margins creating a toxic bath which we will tend to swallow. This leads to the most common entry for infecting organisms to enter the body.

Without the proper quality of tears, the body has a poor defensive barrier to the outside environment.

Treatments for Evaporative Eye disease, includes:

Proper cleaning of lashes and lids. Commercially available lid cleaners on a regular basis will allow your lashes to catch new dust, rather than contributing to a toxic bacterial covering.

Warm lid compresses will soften the oils in the glands, improve blood circulation.

- Lid massages and pinching the lids will massage the various glands, and provide for circulation.

 A balance of omega 3 and omega 6 food sources. Balance does not mean elimination. It means a proper balanced diet.

Meibomian gland expression is an in office procedure done by an optometrist trained to do the procedure. It involves massaging the glands with the aid of a microscope to remove the hardened meibum from the glands openings. A procedure which takes approximately 15 minutes, is not invasive.

How To Choose A Hearing Clinic

In selecting a hearing clinic your doctor or 'ear specialist' may refer you, or you may choose a clinic on your own since no referral is needed. In deciding on the best hearing clinic for you, there are several considerations.

Location: You will likely be making several visits to the clinic particularly if a hearing aid is needed, therefore, a convenient location is recommended. Follow-up appointments for minor hearing aid adjustments, purchase of hearing aid batteries, annual check-ups and hearing aid cleanings are typical.

Office Hours: The clinic should be open on a regular basis with an office and staff that you can visit weekly if needed. Make sure the hours the clinic are open will be convenient for you.

Staff: One of the most important considerations is the staff. Staff must be licensed and qualified to test and fit hearing aids. An Audiologist must have at least a university Masters degree in audiology and be licensed through the College of Audiologists and Speech-Language Pathologists of Ontario (CASLPO). Hearing instrument specialists are certified through a college level program and can fit hearing aids, but may or may not be able to do the testing. Find a professional in whom you are comfortable and confident; someone approachable and listens to any concerns or requests you may have.

Selection: The clinic should carry a number of different types and makes of hearing aids. There is an extensive selection of hearing aids available to accommodate most budgets, lifestyles, personal tastes and needs. Don't feel overwhelmed by all these decisions. An experienced, well-trained professional can help you make these important decisions in your best interest.
