## Cold weather will linger into spring: meteorologist

Don't put away your hats, mitts and scarves just yet.

Spring may be officially here, but the warmer temperatures that come along with the sea-

The Weather Network meteorologist Elena Lappo — based in neighbouring Oakville — said it will be "a slow start to spring" with the colder, winter-like temperatures lingering into the first half of the season.

son are still a ways away.

"In terms of March, and even into the beginning of April, we're expecting to have more below seasonal days than above seasonal," said Lappo.

More snow could come as a result, she said.

"With so much snow on the ground already and with cooler temperatures to start the spring off, we just might see snow on the ground for a bit longer than what we have seen in the past few years," said Lappo.

This winter has been especially hard on Greater Toronto Area (GTA) residents, the coldest since the 1993/94 winter season.

"The winter has definitely been much colder than what we have seen in the past 20 years, but also we've been seeing much milder winters in the last few years and that also adds to the affect of why people feel so much colder," said Lappo.

The list was announced earlier this month.

Halton communities have faced 10 cold alerts affecting a total of 36 days so far this year compared to just three cold alerts spanning six days in 2013.


The alerts are issued by Halton Region when temperatures are expected to fall below -15 C (without wind chill) or when weather con-

rant alerting the community to the risks involved with prolonged exposure.

But things could be worse.

Lappo said Southern Manitoba and Northwestern Ontario, which are already two areas that are typically colder than the GTA, faced a harsher winter, with frigid temperatures 5C colder than normal.

In the GTA, she said, people have been facing temperatures 2-3C below seasonal.



The sun is becoming stronger, the days are becoming longer and the average temperatures on the rise, she said.

"We'll definitely see some warmer spells as well. The overall feel is just going to be milder. Even though days are below seasonal."

With an average daytime high of 5C in March, Lappo added even if temperatures are around zero it will already feel better than the -15C people have been experiencing over the last few months.


