Children's safety course coming up

A new safety course designed to prepare children to stay home alone will soon be introduced in Milton.

Home Alone Safety for Kids — developed by —Oakville's SOS 4 Kids, a sister company of SOS First Aid and Safety Training — will be offered in partnership with the Town of Milton and will be held at the Milton Sports Centre on Saturday, Apr. 26 and Saturday, May 3.

Both sessions will run from 9 to 12:30 p.m.

The course, which costs \$95, uses digital technology and interactive tools to teach children aged nine to 12 about people safety, street smarts, house rules, injury prevention, online safety, fire safety and first aid.

There are fewer stay-at-home parents, so

there comes a point where independence becomes part of development. Some kids are fearful staying home on their own and some parents are fearful of making that first step," said SOS 4 Kids co-founder Velma Ganassini. "There's a planning process the entire family needs to be committed to, to ensure the child's safety."

She said the program began after a number of parents approached her and co-founder Sue Perry to offer a safety course for their children who weren't interested in taking a babysitting class.

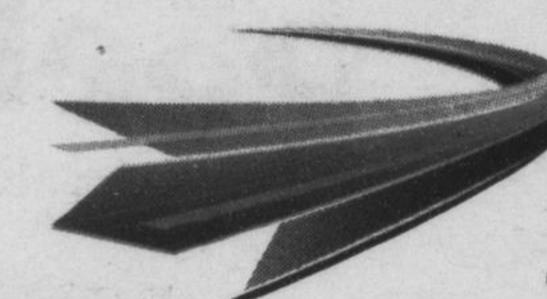
support of the Salvation Army Food Bank.
