liaison for the HCDSB.

"By self-identifying, students and their families will have access to a variety of board and school-sponsored cultural programming, as well as funding support opportunities for aboriginal students that are specific to postsecondary programs."

An open house will be held on Wednesday, Apr. 30 at Jean Vanier Secondary School, 1145 Bronte St. S., from 7 to 9 p.m.

All First Nation, Métis, or Inuit students, who

are 18 years of age or older have the right to self-identify. For students under 18 years of age, a parent or guardian must self-identify on behalf of the student.

The self-identification process is entirely voluntary and confidential. No proof of ancestry 3 is required.
