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
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

"Our pies are made from a time-honoured recipe that was passed along from Grandma Hughes," explains Laura Hughes, co-owner of Springridge Farm. "Pumpkin pie is a true symbol

Springridge Farm's annual Harvest Festival takes place every weekend (including Thanksgiving Monday) from Saturday, September 20 - Sunday, October 26, 2014. "Harvest Festival is all about autumn entertainment," says Farmer John. "It's fun to see families enjoying a day in the country." Harvest Festival activities include wagon rides, a giant corn trail, professional puppet show, spooky Boo Barn and the Fun Farm Yard.
