

Milton seniors strike gold at Ontario Senior Games

A pair of local athletes swam and bowled their way to provincial gold during the recent Ontario Senior Games Association's Summer Games in Windsor/Amherstberg.

Native Miltonian Kevin Elson — who lived in town up until a few weeks ago and still swims at the leisure centre, driving in from Mississauga tied for first in the 65-and-up men's swimming sprints (25m).

Over the two-day event he won both his butterfly races, as well as the opening day's breaststroke and day two's freestyle. That allowed him to top the five-competitor field with Brampton's Terry Campbell.

Milton's Robert Woods and partner Christine Wild of Acton reigned supreme in lawn bowling doubles. In a three-way tie after day one with a 2-1 record, the Milton Lawn Bowling Club members pulled ahead with a 5-1 showing on the second day to edged out teams from Windsor and York.

Milton also collected three silvers and two bronze at the games. Medalists included:


Vis honoured for clutch scoring

Milton's Danielle Vis scored her third gamewinning goal to lead St. Bonaventure University Bonnies women's soccer team to a 2-0 victory at the Big Red Shootout at Cornell University.

Despite outplaying Virginia Military Institute Sunday, St. Bonaventure didn't get on the board until the 74th minute when Vis converted a deflection off a VMI defender from 18 yards out. The Bonnies added a goal in the final minute for a 2-0 victory.

Vis was named to the all-tournament team. The Bishop Reding grad also earned her second Atlantic 10 Conference rookie-of-the-week honour.

Vis leads St. Bonaventure in goals (three) and shots on net (10) and her three game-winners rank second in the conference.
