MILTON TIME CAPSULES

Hundreds take train to hockey game

Time Capsules are gems of information extracted from past issues of the Champion and other publications in order to provide a window into Milton's past.

February 1920

About 250 people took advantage of the special train to Burlington on Friday night and were amply repaid as the hockey match between the Milton and Burlington Intermediate O.H.A. teams proved one of the fastest and most interesting games of the year. The round, which should have been completed with this game, was a tie and both teams were determined to break it, as it would mean the winning of the group. However, when the final period was over the score stood 3-3, leaving the district still tied. It was a hard-fought game from bell to bell and the fast play never lagged through the entire three periods.

By order of the O.H.A. executive another game had to be played on neutral ice to decide the group. About 1200 people witnessed

the game. Burlington's fine rink was packed to capacity and it is said the receipts were in the neighborhood of \$600. The game to decide the tie between Milton and Burlington Intermediates came off in Toronto Tuesday. Milton lost by one goal and failed to get into the second round of the O.H.A. finals.
