Local MPs safe after gunfire

After yesterday (Wednesday) morning's deadly gunfire at the National War Memorial and Parliament Hill in Ottawa, members of parliament representing Milton, Oakville and Burlington were reported to be safe.

The violence started shortly before 10 a.m. when a Canadian soldier standing guard

at the memorial was shot by an unknown gunman. Dozens of shots were fired shortly after in the Centre Block of nearby Parliament Hill.

Early yesterday afternoon, Ottawa police confirmed the male soldier—a Hamilton reservist—and the suspected gunman at Parliament Hill had died. The number and status of other

possible gunmen remained unknown.

Advance voting nearly doubles

Milton may be poised for a spike in municipal election voter turnout, if results from advance polls are any indication.

Over the seven days of advance voting, a total of 3,516 residents cast a ballot. This represents an 88 per cent jump from the 2010 election.

The biggest single day of voting was on Thanksgiving Monday, when 875 Miltonians made their way to Hugh Foster Hall to vote. This marks a 60 per cent increase from the last election.

In 2010 overall, 32.64 per cent of eligible voters — or 15,683 — cast a ballot. That was 2.5 per cent higher than in 2006.
