## Dunley happy with her latest performance

Dunley's 136.62-point performance was good enough for third place at the Skate Canada Challenge, and handily stamped her ticket to next month's nationals in Kingston.

上"I wouldn't say I was surprised ex-

actly, but given how much I've had to scale back on training I'd say I'm happy with bronze," said Dunley, who's now gearing up for her seventh trip to the Canadian championships. "This season's been more about training smart than training

hard."

Specifically, that's meant cutting back on practice jumping — something that didn't seem to hinder her in Quebec.

Nailing her triple Lutz — along with the double Axel-triple toe and triple loop — Dunley scored a senior level personal-best 86.95-point free program that clinched her spot on the podium.

Her short program earned a 49.67.

Despite ongoing back pain trouble, Dunley is still hoping for a top-five finish at nationals, where she'll be joined by two club-mates.

Providing a huge second round jumps in recent years, novice skater Helene Carle went from 34th in the short program up to 10th when it was all said and done — finishing with an all-around score of 92.62.

Rachel LaFleche was 23rd after the junior short program and propelled herself up seven spots to 16th — scoring 108.65 overall — to grab one of the last qualifying spots.


