

# Board hosting information meeting


The Halton District School Board will hold an information session to assist parents with the transition process for junior and senior kindergarten students with special needs.


At Irma Coulson Public School, 625 Sauve St., next Thursday at 7 p.m., the meeting will give parents many details about education.
