"I want to represent my country and be a great role model in my community — to encourage deaf children to try snowboarding and perhaps go to the Deaflympics too someday," he said. "And of course my goal is to bring home some medals."

The Michaelis twins mirrored each other in more than just looks last weekend in Brampton.


The Milton Dynamo Wrestling Club veterans delivered strikingly-similar performances en route to Ontario Amateur championship juvenile gold.


Reding delivers big run to consolation title
