Halton Healthcare Services (HHS) has been honoured for its efforts to serve and promote locally-grown food with an award by the Ontario Greenbelt Fund.

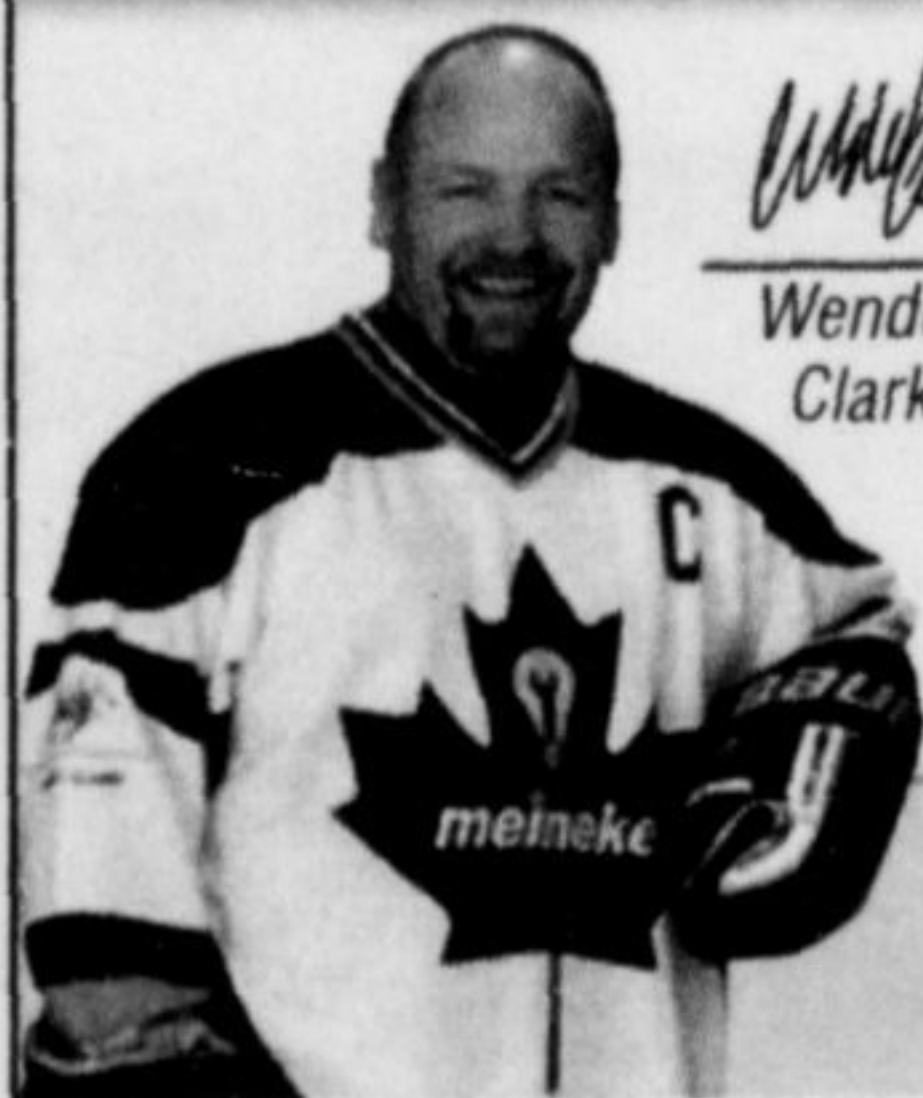
HHS was officially recognized as Local Food Champions in the Broader Public Sector at the 2015 Local Food Symposium in Niagara-on-the-Lake Saturday.
