

✓ What goes in your Blue Box



- Plastic plant pots and trays**
- Clear plastic "clam shell" containers**
- Glass bottles and jars**
 Clear or coloured, food and beverage glass containers
- Empty metal paint cans**
 Dry and lids removed
- Aluminum foil**
 Aluminum foil, aluminum pie plates and baking trays
- Boxboard**
 Flattened cereal, detergent and tissue boxes, etc. (liners go in garbage)
- Cardboard cans**
- Plastic plates, cups and coffee cup lids**
 No cutlery
- Fine paper**
 Computer paper, writing paper, envelopes (including plastic windows), paper bags
- Corrugated cardboard**
 Tie in bundles no larger than 90 cm x 90cm x 30cm (3 ft x 3 ft x 1 ft)
- Black and clear plastic take-out containers**
- Single-serve plastic food containers**
 No film or foil
- Boxed beverage containers**
 Tetra Paks®, juice and soup boxes, gable top containers such as milk and juice cartons
- Magazines and books**
 Hard and soft covered books, telephone books
- Plastic bottles, tubs and lids**
 Cottage cheese, cream cheese, dips, margarine and yogurt tubs and lids. Beverage, soap, cleaning bottles (plastic bottle caps go in garbage). Maximum size 4 litres (1 gallon).
- Metal food and beverage containers**
- Newspapers and flyers**

X What does not go in your Blue Box

- Plastic cutlery, straws and bottle caps**
- Chip bags, wrappers and cookie bags**
- Gift wrap, wrapping paper, ribbons and bows**
- Plastic wrap, bubble wrap and film**
- Plastic bags, baggies and liner bags**
 e.g. cereal bags, grocery bags
- Hangers**
 (metal or plastic)
- Polystyrene and Styrofoam**
- Household items**
 e.g., garden hose, furnace filter
- Ceramics**
 (dishes)
