Trillium grant stirs growth at ActiveChefs in Halton, Peel

More Halton youth will be afforded the tools for a healthy, active lifestyle, thanks to a grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation (OTF). Halton MPP Indira Naidoo-Harris, together

with Labour Minister Kevin Flynn and OTF volunteer Jaz Singh, recently announced that the OTF will be making a five-year commitment of \$363,700 to allow ActiveChefs to expand its operations in Halton and Peel.

The funds will be used to hire two part-time co-ordinators for the program, which engages children and their families in experiential learning related to nutrition, food preparation and active living.

The grant will allow ActiveChefs to reach more than 2,000 youth.


The contest is intended for young people thinking about art school and for those who have never picked up a paintbrush.
