Family barely escapes early-morning fire

Time Capsules are gems of information extracted from past issues of the Champion and other publications in order to provide a window into Milton's past.

February 1921

A fire broke out, cause unknown, early last Saturday morning on the lower floor in the brick dwelling of Robert Deforest, at Milton Heights. Mr. Deforest was away from home. Mrs. Deforest and her two children were in bed upstairs. Fortunately she was awakened, but not until escape was cut off except through an upper window from which she screamed for help. Alex Pryde, her next neighbor, heard her, rushed out in his night clothing and placed a ladder below the window. The children were got out first and Mrs. Deforest followed them barely in time, just as the floor collapsed. She is suffering from burns at the home of her neighbor Mrs. Transom. Nothing was saved except lives. Loss on building and contents \$3,800. Insurance \$2,700.

Archie McCallum, of Winnipeg, Man. is in town for the first time in ten years, at the home of his sister, Mrs. Hanley. He is a veteran of the Northwest rebellion. One of his sons, Archie

Jr., was killed at Amiens, France in 1917. Mr. McCallum will go back to Winnipeg next week.


Nassagaweya's monument to its fallen soldiers will cost about \$4,000 and will be paid for by a taxation of 3 mills on the dollar, which



Graham Bros. Construction will be rehabilitating Lawson Road using cold in place recycled expanded asphalt mix (CIREAM). The scope of work also includes base and top asphalt works, line painting and shoulder work.
