Oakville's Millennium Clock Tower has had a facelift — thanks to a Milton company After 15 years, the Towne Square's tower clock was looking a little haggard so a painting contracting company gave it a makeover.

"The Canadian weather and sun exposure, and all the other elements, faded the clock over the past 15 years," said Ed Forte, president of CIP industrial/commercial painting contractors of Milton.

starting to happen and that wasn't good," Forte said. "We basically got rid of all the white rust and corrosion, grinded it and sanded it.

"It was very worn-down and tired looking." Forte's company has done work for the Town of Oakville for the past 25 years. When it became known the Town wanted the clock to 5 be spruced up, Forte submitted a proposal N and his bid was accepted.

"The Town wanted it done before the long Q weekend so we fortunately had great weather and we managed to do the job," he said. Forte has so far received a lot of positive feedback.

"Some people actually thought it was a com- of pletely new clock," he said. "One person said they thought they liked the old one better."
