Regional taxes expected to rise in 2016

Halton residents could see a tax hike of 1.9 per cent on the regional portion of their property tax bill to maintain and improve regional service levels for 2016.

The proposed increase, to be discussed at standing committee meetings Dec. 1-3, translates into a \$16 increase for a home worth \$400,000.

Commissioner of Finance and Regional Treasurer Mark Scinocca told Regional council recently that one of the 2016 Budget and Business Plan's key priorities was keeping the Region's tax rate increases at, or below, the rate of inflation.

The proposed increase does not include a 1.9 per cent tax hike in the Halton police budget or municipal and education taxes.
