Miltonians vie for Standardbred Canada Driver of the Year title

Two of Milton's top harness racing reinsmen will go head-to-head one last time before closing the books on 2015.

Sylvain Filion and Randy Waples were officially named finalists for Standardbred Canada's Driver of the Year title when the O'Brien Award nominees were announced in late December.

Both are looking to add to their championship trophy collections, each having captured the award on multiple occasions.

A back-to-back winner in 2012 and 2013,

50-year-old Filion enjoyed his best season since 2012. He drove 343 winners and led all Canadian drivers in the earnings column with more than \$6.9 million. On November 16 he hit another career milestone, recording his 8,000th victory at Wood-

bine. He's the 29th driver in history to reach
