



**Fifth Line Improvements
 Britannia Road to Derry Road
 Class Environmental Assessment Study**

Notice of Public Comment Invited

The Town of Milton is carrying out a Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) Study for the improvements of Fifth Line between Britannia Road and Derry Road. The Class EA Study is being undertaken in accordance with Schedule 'C' of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment process (2000, as amended in 2007 & 2011), which is approved under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act. MMM Group Limited has been retained to assist with the study. The study area is shown on the key plan.

Fifth Line between Britannia Road and Derry Road is an existing two-lane rural roadway. Lands on both sides of Fifth Line are part of the Derry Green Corporate Business Park, and are mainly designated for business uses. Lands in the south part of the study area are designated for agricultural uses. The Class EA Study is evaluating the need for roadway improvements to support future growth of the Derry Green Corporate Business Park.

The first Public Information Centre (PIC #1) was held on March 11, 2015 to review the problem being addressed, background information, the alternative solutions being considered and preliminary design of alternatives. Following PIC #1, the Project Team reviewed the comments received at PIC #1, analyzed and evaluated the design alternatives, as well as the identification of the preliminary preferred design alternative.

In accordance with the planning and design process for Schedule 'C' projects of the Municipal Class EA, the Project Team is providing a Public Information Package which identifies the proposed improvements on Fifth Line within the Study Area. The final push is on, Milton. With just four weeks remaining in its 2015/16 fundraising campaign, United Way Milton still needs roughly \$200,000 to meet its goal of \$1 million. Launched in September with a kick-off celebration at Mohawk Race-track that included Deadmau5 and Tiger Jeet Singh Jr., the campaign has included a number of successful events such as the Mayor's Golf Tournament (raising \$180,000) and some hefty support from Mattamy Homes (\$77,712) and Johnson Controls (\$30,000). Milton individuals and businesses are now being asked to get the organization to the finish line and help with funding for the 29 local agencies that benefit from the United Way's support. "The \$1 million is so important for the community. Fundamentally, it is not OK for a child to be on a waiting list in a time of crisis, that people are going without nourishment or seniors are isolated," said United Way Milton CEO Kate Holmes, touching on just a few of the ways the community is aided by her organization, with more than 25,000 Miltonians helped out each year.
