'We're still fighting the fight,' says Trillium school parent

Education Minister Liz Sandals announced last week that she's reopening enrolment for the Province's demonstration schools for students with learning disabilities, including Milton's Trillium School.

But the perceived victory has done little to allay the fears of parents, who still think the Liberal government may ultimately shut the facilities down in an effort to save money.

"We were anticipating something like this. Unfortunately it doesn't guarantee they're keeping the schools open," said Trillium school council chair Ruth Bourachot. "They did this to throw a wrench to see if we'll back off, but we're not."

Sandals and the Province have been under fire since recently initiating a consultation process on the future of the schools for pupils with severe dyslexia. During the consultations the Province suspended enrolment at the schools, which fed into parents' fears that the facilities would soon close their doors for good.

In Sandals' statement released April 13, she said, "The admission process was put on hold while we focused on consultations. However, I committed to looking at the admission process again towards the end of the consultations. We are now resuming the 2016-2017 admissions process for all four demonstration schools. Enrolment at Robarts and CJL Schools for the Deaf will also continue for 2016-2017."

The statement goes on to say, "I want to thank everyone who participated in the consultation process. While no other decisions have been made, the Ministry of
