## Crime Stoppers hopes re-enactment will help solve Milton cold case §

Halton Crime Stoppers is hoping a re-enactment of a 2007 homicide, filmed in Oakville May 18, will finally bring justice for the victim's family.

Raymond Michael Venerus, 55, was murdered outside his home on Dublin Line in Milton on Feb. 21, 2007.

Police said around 9:50 a.m. on that day, Venerus got into his Jeep Cherokee and drove to the end of his driveway, where unknown suspect(s) approached him.

"He was not a man to back down from a confrontation and he stopped his Jeep and got out," said Det. Const. Paul Proteau, Halton Crime Stoppers Co-ordinator.

"Raymond Venerus was fatally shot once in the head. To date, police have been unable to identify the person responsible for shooting him."

It has been nearly a decade since this murder took place and Proteau said the re-enactment

video, filmed at a residence on Burnhamthorpe Road West by CHCH, is intended to get people thinking about this incident again in the hope that someone may remember some crucial piece of information or have a change of heart and tell Crime Stoppers what they know.

"Mr. Venerus has family in the Milton area, who deserve to know what happened to their father and grandfather," said Proteau.

"Police believe there are those in the area who can still shed some light on this investi-

gation and we are appealing to anyone with a information to come forward."

Proteau said a lot can happen in 10 years.

During that time, the killer may have told someone what they did or someone could have found out.

"Maybe there is a spouse or ex-partner or friend of the person who committed the offence, whose relationship with that person has soured and they are ready to talk about this now," said Proteau.

est in the notion of reducing the number of municipal elected officials.


The goal is to have all changes decided on and in place before the 2018 municipal election.




