Harness racing trio set to pace for charity in Alberta

Jody Jamieson will have some extra incentive driving him this Sunday (August 14).

One of three area standardbred drivers set to take to Calgary's Century Downs, the Camp-E bellville racing standout will be vying for a -hefty purse for Autism Speaks when he takes to the track for Pacing for Charity.

"It's still a relatively new track and they want to become a part of the community (through the fundraiser) and get some fresh faces out z there," said Jamieson, a two-time World Driving Championship winner and three-time

O'Brien Award recipient as Standardbred Canada's Driver of the Year. "I love being able to do this kind of stuff. This industry has given my family and I so much. I've been able to travel the world on the wings of harness racing, so when there's opportunities like this to give back I'm more than willing to do so."

An announcement earlier this year by the Ontario government that it would be removing autistic children five and older from the Intensive Behavioural Intervention (IBI) wait list struck a strong chord with Jamieson, prompt-



ing him to select Autism Speaks as his latest racing beneficiary.

Recently — after a massive public outcry the government said it will provide autistic children of all ages with more flexible services catered to their individual needs.

Autism Speaks will receive the standard five per cent that Jamieson earns from the afternoon's slate of races.

Also part of Pacing for Charity will be Moffat's Jack Moiseyev and James MacDonald of Guelph, who'll be racing for the Juvenile

Diabetes Research Foundation and Alberta Cancer Foundation respectively.

In late June, MacDonald topped the Ontario Regional Driving Championship, booking passage to this fall's nationals, while Jamieson fell just one point shy of securing the second and final spot needed for advancement.
