Battle of Vimy Ridge

Vimy Ridge is a story of bravery and sacrifice, the Vimy Foundation reports. During the First World War, the Germans had successfully resisted earlier Allied attacks and and heavily defended the ridge when Canadians took it. The Germans retreated. Canadian assault troops went over the ridge in the early morning hours of April 9, 1917 — Easter Monday. They attacked in to enemy lines amid snow, sleet and driving wind. Some 3,593 Canadian soldiers were killed during the battle. In appreciation of Canada's war efforts, France granted our nation a 107-hectare parcel of land at Vimy to build and maintain a memorial.
