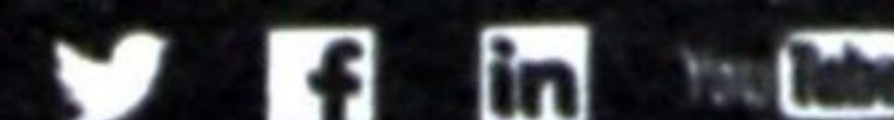

Please do not place household hazardous waste (HHW) at the curb—it will not be collected. Please do not place HHW in the garbage and do not pour down the drain or storm sewer. HHW can injure waste collectors and can damage the environment if disposed of improperly.

Household hazardous waste can be disposed of, **free of charge**, at the Household Hazardous Waste Depot or on a Special Waste Drop-off Day:

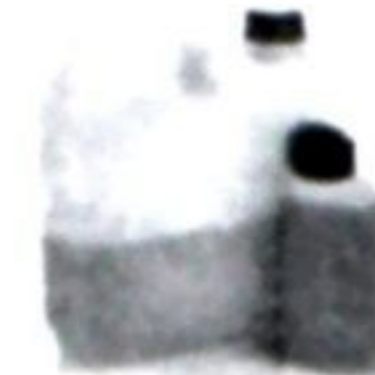

Paint and Stain Reuse Depot

Painting your house? Pick up and drop off usable paint and stain at the Paint and Stain Reuse Depot free of charge.

The Paint and Stain Reuse Depot is located beside the Household Hazardous Waste Depot. Open from spring to fall.

Empty metal paint cans with lids removed, can be placed in your Blue Box

Empty plastic paint cans can be placed in your regular garbage
