The Halton District School Board is producing a three-part video series to show parents and guardians how their kids' schools engage elementary and secondary students in math instruction.


The educational videos are in response to the Ontario Ministry of Education's release of the Renewed Math Strategy.

The first video in the series is called Beyond The Numbers: Understanding the Renewed Math Strategy. It outlines mathematics in the board, as well as the objectives of the remaining videos.

The second part, to be released in late May, will show "math instruction in action and innovative teaching in the classroom," states a board pressrelease.

The third and final video, to be released in September, will provide supports, resources and practical ideas for parents and guardians to helpthem support math instruction at home.
