Mrs. John H. C. Durham of West Palm Beach, Fla., passed away in Miami Hospital on Nov. 21, following a short illness. She was born near St. Mary's Ont., of Scottish ancestry, and was daughter of the late Robert D. and Jessie Gordon Mitchell. In December 1896, she married John H. C. Durham of Toronto. She resided in Toronto until 1908, when Mr. and Mrs. Durham took up residence on their farm at Craigmore, Bond Lake, where she lived until two years ago, when she moved to West Palm Beach.
