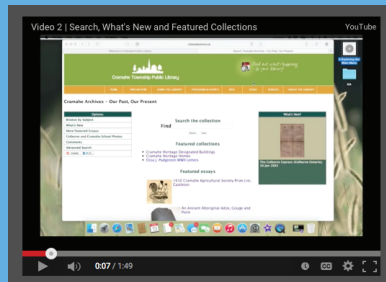
Percy E. Giles, born March 18, 1898 in Walpole Twp. Haldimand County, Ontario. Son of Mary Catherine Carpenter and Benjamin Giles died October 18th, 1918 in France, was buried Requecourt Communal Cemetery, Nord, France. Stone placed in Hagarville Union Cemetery, E240 East Side Killed in action in France with the 114th Battalion Haldimand Rifles, October 18, 1918. #739672
