Marcus is the Manager of the Law and Technology Program at the University of Ottawa. He is a member of the Canadian Internet Policy and Public Interest Clinic (CIPPIC) internal advisory board. He is also a member of the Law Society of Upper Canada, Electronic Frontier Canada, and the Free/Open Source Research Community at MIT. Marcus is responsible for the Canadian translation of the popular Creative Commons license and a prominent figure in the Canadian open source community - see: <http://creativecommons.ca>.

Primary research interests include both emerging legal issues stemming from technological innovation and the use of technology in effecting law/regulation. His recent research has examined technology law as it applies to open source software, e-commerce, copyright, knowledge management and file-sharing, and the use of technology in the practice of law.

As the country is about to embark on an intense national lobby on copyright, Professor Bornfreund illuminates the cultural landscape in which the arguments will be played out.
