- Arrange public library visits

- Invite authors, illustrators, poets and storytellers to work with classes
- Share favourite books of staff, parents and famous Canadians
- Offer an evening session on the research process

- Create literary quizzes and contests
- Post reviews of popular fiction on the school web site
- Organize book clubs both face to face and virtual
- Take students to a specialized library
- Facilitate and support independent reading programs
- Celebrate special literary occasions
- Initiate school-wide/community-wide reading and writing events
- Support student writing and publishing of poetry and books for younger children
