A Summary of the National Union Catalogue

OLA participated in a **National Union Catalogue** roundtable on March 2 to discuss the replacement of AMICUS with the OCLC and to identify any issues or concerns of Canadian libraries prior to contract sign off.

The key questions/concerns from the roundtable were: Cost to libraries, data privacy, open data, Canadian resource visibility, support for standards, mobile support, linked open data, application programming interface, and updating the National Union Catalogue.
