## FUNDING

### Infrastructure Funding for Public Libraries

The Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP) is a cost-shared infrastructure funding program between the federal government, provinces and territories, and municipalities and other recipients. This program will see up to \$30 billion in combined federal, provincial and other partner funding, under four priority areas, including Community, Culture and Recreation.

The Community, Culture and Recreation stream will support community infrastructure priorities across the province, improving access to and/or quality of community, cultural, and recreation priority infrastructure projects. Municipalities and First Nations are eligible to apply for funding for cultural facilities including libraries.
