It was ruled that, though the Queen can, ex mero motu, create a bishopric in a Crown Colony, or one having no local legislature, she cannot do so in one which has such a legislature, without a special act being first passed by it authorizing her to issue letters patent for the purpose. Reresentative institutions had been granted to Natal in 1847, and to Capetown in 1850; and, consequently, the letters patent of Drs. Gray out the necessary authorization, were mere waste paper, null and void for any legal purpose. On the same principle was the question of jurisdiction decided.
