WHEREAS, AN ACT PASSED IN

Intended, "An Act to provide against the in-

troduction and spreading of disorders affecting cer-

tain animals," is hereby given to the Royal Assent.

The same is to take effect on the day it may appear to be necessary in order to prevent the introduction of con-

tagious or infectious disorders affecting sheep, cattle,

horses, and other animals, and check such dis-

orders from spreading.

And whereas a contagious disease or epidemic af-

fecting cattle prevails in many parts of Europe

and America, and is spreading and extending, and where

the introduction of the same into this Province, that the importation

by sea of certain animals and articles should

be prohibited; save and except such cargo or charges,

or part of cargo, as may be required for the health

and safety of the animals and articles imported.
