THE NEW ISLAND

Latest Reports of the Volcanic Wonder

in the Archipelago - English, Greek

and Russian Men of War Pre-

siding Over the Island.

The sudden rise of a volcanic island in the

Grecian Archipelago is one of the most re-

markable phenomena of modern times. A

correspondent at Patheque, Long Island,

sends us an extract from a private letter,

written near the scene of the occurrence, giv-

ing the following interesting details:-

SYRA, GREECE, Feb. 15, 1866.

The island of Santorini has been in eruption

for some days, some say more. It

is about sixty miles from here, and the water

level is rising to a tremendous degree.

An island has sprung up under the sea,

not distant from Santorini, which seems

to be a mountain of coal or lava, and is now

about five hundred feet above the surface.

Yesterday a special steamer was

sent to the island, and the French Consul

has just arrived. Among the re-

turning passengers was a Russian gentleman

who landed on the new island, and brought

back with him some fine, coal-laden, which

some unskilful sailors had prematurely de-

posited upon the new island, which we have

named the "Phoenician."

The new island is several miles in circum-

ference, but being of volcanic origin, it is

supposed to be a great tunnel, like a boiling

cauldron, and at night shows white flames.

There is one curious fact in this connec-

tion. About ten years ago, a vessel of con-

siderable size was sunk at the foot of San-

torini, and now, all at once, up comes

this vessel as good as new.
