FENIANISM AND THE PAPACY.

The Rome correspondent of the London Times says: "A highly respectable Irish ecclesiastic had heard of the existence of the Fenian spirit in the Irish College, but knew nothing from his own observation; it might be so, may, was tikely, and young men had expressed themselves warmly. He had heard, too, of an effort being made to create an impression on the mind of the Pope, " but they'il get nothing by it." he added : " His Holiness cannot depart from a principal he has once laid down and made known." Two years have clapsed since the American bishops, of whom there are about thirty-five, wrote-that is to say, a few of them -to Rome for instructions how to act towards the sect then rising into existence. The answer, as might have been expected, directed that it should be discountenanced. Since then only four of the Roman Catholic Bishops in the United States, and they are Irishmen, have openly protested against Fenianism. They are the Archbishop of St. Louis; the Bishop of Saturday, 16th day of December, 1865. Philadelphia, educated in the Propaganda; the Bishop of Chicago, educated at Maynooth; other Bishops, without expressing any sym-

pathy with it, have permitted the epidemic to spread. As to the feeling and action of His Holiness, there can be no doubt. "A friend of mine, who lately had the honor of an audience, tells me that he spoke to the Pope of the disorders which he himself had witnessed in Iteland, for which His Holiness expressed great concern, and was gratified at hearing that his communication to Archbishop Cullen had been received with so much satisfaction by all men of order and picty. There are several lrish families at present in Rome, Roman Catholics, and of considerable social position, but all approved, and were greatly relieved at the suspension of the habeas corpus act. Of Irish ecclesiastics of high rank, Dr. Kirby, the rector of the Irish college, and Monsigneri Quin and Murray, who leave shortly for Austria, in the strongest terms de nounce the mevement. Even here, therefore, the purely Irish element, especially if it be of any social consideration and ecclesiastical, reprobates a movement opposed to all laws,
